



Volunteers Tyree, Anderson honored by A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier

Anderson, who lives in St. Albans, W.Va., is the chair of the Player Transportation Committee. He began in 2011 as a Marshall on holes 1 and 18 and has volunteered in every tournament since then.

"I originally started volunteering so that I could share this great experience with my father-in-law," Anderson remembered.

He learned the ropes of Player Transportation from previous chair, Randy Lucas, whom he labeled as a “great mentor,” and he enjoyed the assignment so much it became his permanent position.

“I enjoy serving the PGA TOUR players, their families and the volunteers,” said Anderson, who is a Sales Professional at Lifetouch National School Studios. “I want to thank all of the hard-working and dedicated volunteers on the Player Transportation Committee for making A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier a success.”
